"I think the tree should sit there," said Kris.

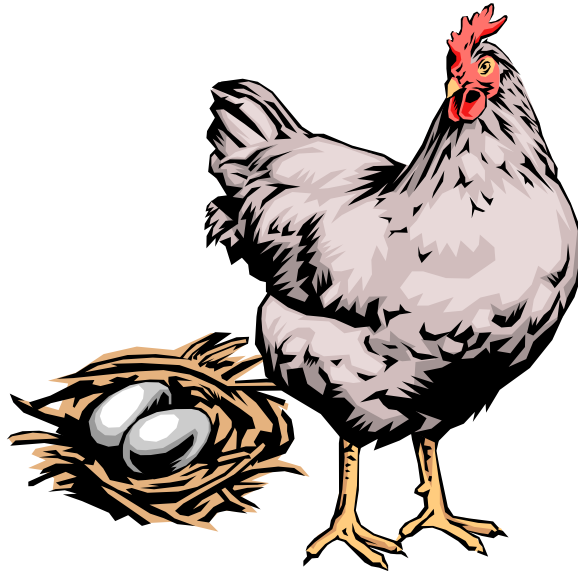
"Where should the tree sit?" said Hank.

Kris and the Hen

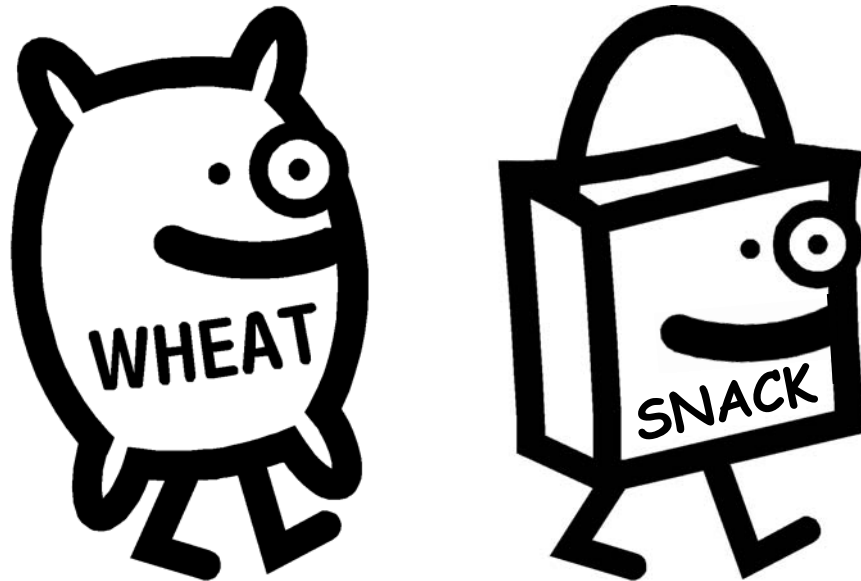
"I am Kris, and this is a hen," said Kris.

"I am Ned. I am a smart tent," said Ned.

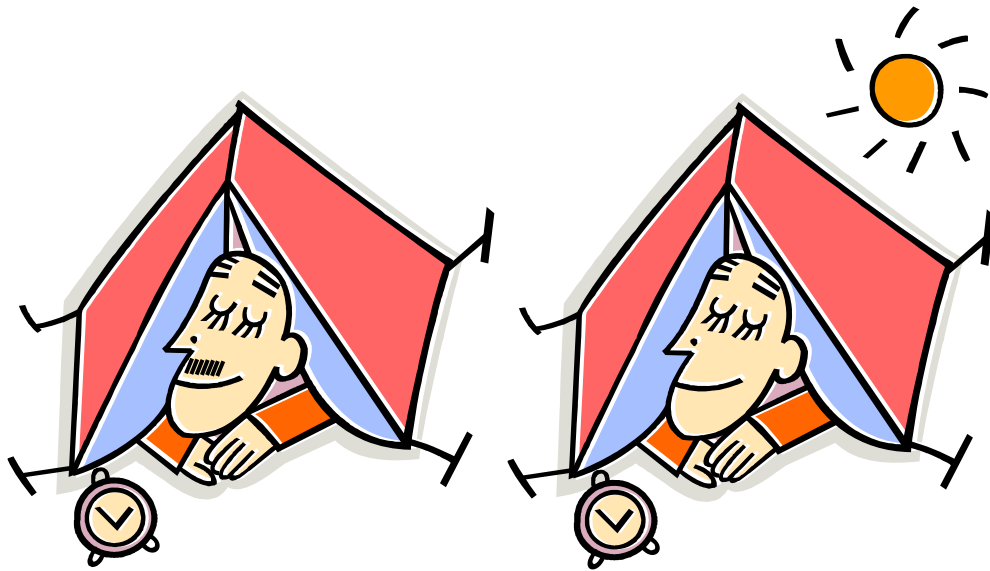
"I wish I was a smart red tent," he said.

"I am Sid. This tent is neat," said Sid.

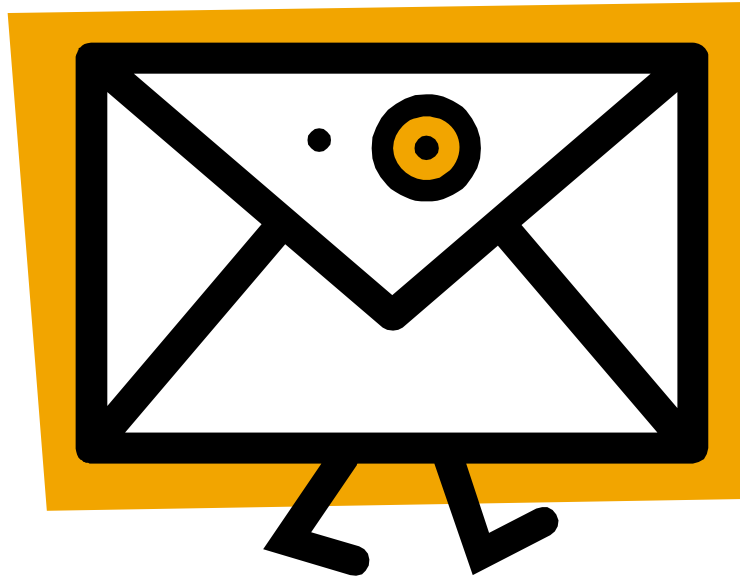
"I am Ned. This tent is neat, too," said Ned.
